COVID 19:

This last year has been a challenging one!! And the current Chief & Council has made the safety, security and health of our community and employees of paramount importance. When the COVID pandemic started in early 2020, we worked as a team to plan and coordinate how we would keep our elders, children, and families safe from this potentially fatal virus. We met weekly to discuss how we would do this and how we would continue to maintain the safety net we created in and around both Henvey and French River # 13...It wasn't easy, but to this date we have not had a positive COVID infection in

our community. And we hope to keep it this way. Because working together in harmony and with due diligence is what a First Nations political relationship does for their community and its members.

FOOD DISBURSEMENT:

Within the first 3 months following the lockdown, present Chief & Council located and ordered a large quantity of perishables and non-perishables to keep our most vulnerable safe and with a healthy array of food to maintain their stay at home status. This was done to minimize our community members need to travel outside the F.N. and thereby increasing their chance of being exposed to the COVID virus.
